

VISITOR REGULATIONS OF GROSS-ROSEN MUSEUM IN ROGOŹNICA

Gross-Rosen Museum is a site of martyrdom of European nations, located on the territory of the former German Nazi Concentration Camp Gross-Rosen.

Gross-Rosen Museum is a Memorial that requires respect for its victims, and appropriate behavior.

General information

1. The Museum and all the historical structures and items located on its grounds make up an integral whole protected by law. It is prohibited to move, remove or damage any of the structures or items on the grounds of the Museum and under its protection; as well as to do any exploratory, mining, and excavating works.
2. The Museum is open all year round except of 1st January, 25th December and the first day of Easter. For detailed information about opening hours, please go to www.gross-rosen.eu
3. The Museum may be visited individually, and in groups. Groups of 10 persons and larger are obliged to purchase a guiding service which is provided by a Museum's guide. Prices are in accordance with the current price-list. For detailed information about visiting Gross-Rosen Museum, please go to www.gross-rosen.eu
4. For the time of visiting, children, and juveniles stay under protection of the adults.
5. External guides are prohibited to work in Gross-Rosen Museum.
6. Gatherings, and ceremonies require written consent of Gross-Rosen Museum's director.
7. The rules of media presence on the site of the Museum should be agreed with the Museum's director.
8. It is forbidden to promote contents that are against the law.

Order Regulations

1. Due to the specific character of the Museum's area (e.g.: unevenness of the territory, drains, cavities, and ditches), visitors should be particularly careful. In winter visiting follows only along the delimited paths.
2. It is allowed to take photographs, and make films only for private use. Taking photographs, and making films for commercial purposes is forbidden. Film material or photographs' content shall not be at variance with the historical truth, gravity of the place, or reputation of survivors of the concentration camp Gross-Rosen.
3. Drones are banned on the site of the Museum.
4. Museum's parking is only for the visitors who purchased the parking ticket.

Prohibitions:
